Autumn Away Walking to Isle of Purbeck . As discussed with Alan Garner of Secret Hills Walking, during our weekend at Shrewsbury, he is finding it increasingly difficult to make bookings for groups over weekend (apparently this is a national trend, possibly resulting from more couples wishing to take "staycations" in picturesque areas of the UK).
